

2023 Collections and Evaluation

The following analytical report details the annual program performance for mercury thermostat collection in the state of New Hampshire in 2023.

A few of the program highlights for 2023 are included below:


- In 2023 the program **collected 6.6 lbs. of mercury** in New Hampshire. Since 2001, the annual quantity of mercury collected in New Hampshire has averaged 10.4 lbs.
- The program collected **982 whole thermostats in 2023**. This was a 21% increase over the number of thermostats collected in 2022. Since 2001, the average thermostat count per year is 1,270.
- The average number of whole thermostats collected per bin in 2023 was 34 thermostats, an increase from 25 in 2022.
- The counties with the most bins and thermostats returned in 2023 were Merrimack County (9 bins, 419 thermostats), Hillsborough County (11 bins, 352 thermostats), and Rockingham County (3 bins, 127 thermostats).
- In 2023, 20% of the partner locations returned at least one bin.
- A total of 20 'Miss You' calls were placed in 2023.

Section 1: Program Analytics

Section 1 of this report examines the annual performance of the thermostat collection recycling program in terms of bins, thermostats, and mercury collected as well as the year-over-year progression of the program. On average, the program has collected 10.4 lbs. of mercury and 1,270 whole thermostats per year since 2001. In 2023 the program collected 6.6 lbs. of mercury from 982 thermostats. Figure 1 displays the total number of bins, the total number of thermostats, and the quantity of mercury collected in the state since the beginning of the program.

Figure 2 displays the number of bins collected in New Hampshire since the initiation of the collection program, as well as the total number of bins collected in the U.S. over the same period. The number of bins collected in New Hampshire has generally increased from 2001 to 2012. In 2015, bin returns increased again, peaking with highest number of bins returned in 2017 with 63 bins. In 2023, the number of bins returned was 29 bins.



The 6.6 lbs. of mercury collected in New Hampshire in 2023 was 15% higher than the 5.7 lbs. collected in 2022. Figure 3 displays the quantity of mercury collected in New Hampshire over time as well as the annual percent change in New Hampshire and nationally.




Figure 5 - Whole Thermostats Collected in New Hampshire and Nationally Over Time and Annual Percent Change

New Hampshire collected 982 thermostats in 2023. This was a 21% increase over the number of thermostats collected in 2022. Figure 4 displays the total number of thermostats collected in New Hampshire and nationally, and Figure 5 shares the underlying data as well as the calculated annual percent change.

Figure 6 displays the monthly distribution of bins and thermostats collected in New Hampshire in 2023.




Figure 7 shows the average number of thermostats per bin returned per month for the year.




Figure 8 displays the average number of thermostats returned per bin in New Hampshire and in the U.S. since the beginning of the New Hampshire program. Nationally, the number of thermostats per bin has been decreasing annually since 2000. In New Hampshire a similar pattern is observed but for a few specific years. The number of thermostats per bin in 2023 (34 thermostats per bin avg.) increased from 2022 (29 thermostats per bin avg.).






Figure 9 plots the total bins returned over time along with the average number of thermostats per bin over the same period. In general, the number of bins returned in New Hampshire increased steadily from 2001 to 2017. At the same time, thermostats per bin remained consistent until 2009, after which the trend in thermostats per bin dropped. A negative correlation has been identified between the number of bins returned since 2009 and the number of thermostats per bin.




SECTION 2: Channel Partner Analysis

Section 2 of the report examines the partner locations in more detail. Thermostats collected in New Hampshire were through wholesalers (63.1%) and household hazardous waste facilities (36.9%).

Figure 10 shows the distribution of thermostats collected by location type in 2023.



The number of bins returned in 2023 increased from 2022 levels across wholesalers and household hazardous waste facilities. Figure 11 displays the change in the number of bins returned by thermostat collection type over time in New Hampshire.



In 2023, 20% of New Hampshire locations possessing a collection bin sent back at least one bin for recycling, an increase from the 15% in 2022. The distribution is displayed in Figure 12.




Figure 13 displays the total bins and thermostats returned by county in 2023. An analysis of the top performing counties revealed that Merrimack County (9 bins, 419 thermostats), Hillsborough County (11 bins, 352 thermostats), and Rockingham County (3 bins, 127 thermostats) returned the greatest number of bins and thermostats in 2023.

TRC partner The Granite Group (380 thermostats) returned the highest number of thermostats in New Hampshire in 2023, followed by Sid Harvey (123 thermostats) and Dowling Corporation (84 thermostats). Apart from these locations, one other program partner returned more than 50 thermostats each. Figure 14 displays the top performers in terms of total thermostats returned in 2023.



TRC conducted 'miss you' calls in 2023 to increase the number of bins and thermostats returned in New Hampshire. These activities included 'miss you' calls to collection locations that may not have returned a bin recently. In 2023, a total of 20 'miss you' calls were placed. Figure 16 displays the relationship between the number of site visits per month (0), the bins returned per month, and the number of thermostats (in 100's) returned per month.





Figure 17 displays the relationship between the number of calls per month, the bins returned per month and the number of thermostats (by 100's) returned per month. In 2023, there was no correlation between activities performed and the number of thermostats returned.



SECTION 3: Comparisons to National and Other States' Data

To compare how the New Hampshire collection partners performed in 2023, the national average for the number of bins returned per location that returned at least one bin was calculated and compared to the New Hampshire average since 2012. The average number of bins does not include locations that did not return any bins in that year. It should be noted that when making comparisons each state has different regulations, a different mix of housing types, local policies, and incentives that may have a unique impact on returns. Overall, the average number of bins returned per location per year was lower in New Hampshire than the U.S. average, as shown in Figure 18.



Figure 21 displays total percentage of locations that actively participated in the program (active participation defined as sending back at least one bin) in 2023, for all the states that mandate thermostat returns reporting as well as the U.S. national average for all states (reporting and non-reporting). In 2023, 20% of the locations in New Hampshire returned at least one bin compared to a national average of 18%. The highest percentage of locations returning a bin in 2023 amongst states that mandate thermostat returns reporting was Rhode Island (73%).




Figure 22 compares the New Hampshire and national rates for several analytics. These include: total whole thermostats, bins, and loose switches collected, number of thermostats collected by total locations and per actively participating locations, number of thermostats per bin returned on average, equivalent average, and number of mercury thermostat equivalents returned in 2023. The equivalent average is an average of the number of switches in whole thermostats collected in New Hampshire, and it is used to represent and equivalent number of thermostats from returned loose switches. The thermostat equivalent number includes the totals of whole thermostats returned plus the number of thermostats estimated from loose switches. Figure 23 ranks the states for each category. The states displayed are those that mandate thermostat returns reporting and the U.S. average is for all states that return bins (reporting and non-reporting).

2023 Collections by Brand

In New Hampshire, Thermostat Recycling Corporation (TRC) recovered 982 mercury thermostats. A total of 6.6 pounds of mercury was diverted from solid waste. *Please note the explanation of the converted thermostats or thermostat equivalents below.¹ An example of the mercury ampoule is shown below.



As required by the state statute, a table of thermostat brand holders with their corresponding thermostats, the number of switches and the pounds of mercury recycled is below. It is important to note that there remain non-members whose thermostats the TRC collection program recycles. They are listed in the table as "Non-Member Brands".

¹ A mercury thermostat contains a variable amount of mercury ampoules or "switches" attached to the subbase of the thermostat. These glass ampoules often are collected in the recycling container without the intact thermostat attached to them. TRC collects and counts these loose ampoules and recycles them. To derive the converted thermostat or thermostat equivalent, the program takes the following calculations to develop the converted thermostat or thermostat equivalent. First, TRC will count the total whole (intact) thermostats collected in the recycling bins. From these units, there is an intact ampoules count. TRC then takes the intact ampoules divided by the whole (intact) thermostats or otherwise known as the conversion ratio. After the conversion ratio is calculated, TRC will multiple the loose mercury switches by the conversion ratio. Lastly, we add this result to the whole (intact) thermostats to produce the converted thermostats or thermostat equivalents.

Current Collection Locations

Small Pails and Green Bins

In 2023, TRC shipped 58 small pails to collection points around the country. We also shipped 374 new green bins. In comparison, the program shipped 201 new green bins in 2022 and 76 small pails². Collection locations either requested the new pail when they signed up to participate in the program or chose to switch out their bin with a pail due to decreased collections. The large green bins which have been the staple of the program continued to be replenished as they were returned for processing. Because the containers are reused and bar coded, we anticipate that the request for new containers will decrease as the program continues.

• Of the totals provided, TRC shipped one new small pail and twelve new large bins in the state.

Collection Location Outbound Phone Calls

Our outbound phone calls have been branded internally as the "Miss You Call" process. These calls promote collection container returns and serve as a reminder to locations that have not returned any thermostats. TRC allocates these "miss you calls" to collection sites that have not returned a container in over a year. These calls serve as a friendly customer service check to see if any of the program materials need to be replenished or if missing containers need to be replaced. In total, the program called 1,432 current collection locations in 2023, compared to 1,922 in 2022. The decline in the number of calls completed is a positive sign that more locations were returning a bin without being prompted in 2023, and therefore did not require a "Miss You Call".

Completed 20 calls to encourage shipping the recycling container compared to 79 a year prior.

² New bin orders coincide with accounts that open new stores, move or lose their existing containers.

Collection Location Postcards

Postcards are sent to all locations that have not returned a container in the past year. These postcards serve as a reminder to locations and assist with updating addresses in the database. In 2023, TRC mailed 10,204 postcards.

• Mailed 316 reminder postcards compared to 389 a year prior.

Collection Location Emails

TRC emailed locations three weeks after receiving a postcard to encourage them to directly ship the recycling container. These emails contain step-by-step instructions for shipping and direct contact information for missing shipping labels or further questions. In 2023, TRC emailed 2,953 locations.

 Emailed 27 collection locations three weeks after receiving the reminder postcard to ship their container.

Collection Location Site Visits

Throughout the year, our team completed 426 site visits in numerous states. The purpose of site visits is to inform the location of the requirements of participation, what specifically the statute requires of them, assist with shipment of the recycling container, and to answer any questions they may have. We often gather valuable information during the site visit which is used to enhance TRC's outreach and update the database with current contact details.

No site visits were completed at collection locations in New Hampshire.

HVAC Industry

The HVAC industry is our most productive and most engaged channel for recycling mercury containing thermostats. We consider this industry to be the manufacturers, wholesale distributors, and contractors which are intimately involved with the recovery of mercury thermostats. TRC took the following actions:

 Continued the "Banish Mercury Off the Planet" (BMOP) Competition encouraging all HARDI wholesalers to compete through collections. Included direct marketing to over 17,000 individual HARDI members. The annual competition recovered 194 pounds of mercury from 154 HVAC wholesalers. More than 300 branch locations returned collection bins during the contest period.



Waste Related Sector and Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Industry


The waste-related sector remains an important sector for TRC to target individuals and those residents performing DIY thermostat installations. These attempts were to gain new collection locations, form better relationships with the audience and raise overall awareness of the TRC program. As a result of these learnings, TRC took the following actions:

- Scoured google alerts for HHW events to target phone call or email outreach to encourage them to use the program. Sent 21 emails to facilities, offering a free container.



Digital Summary

This report summarizes all digital efforts in spreading TRC's message in 2023 – including search engine optimization (SEO) and digital advertising. Digital advertising included search engine marketing (SEM) ads through Google Performance Max; social media ads through LinkedIn; and programmatic ads through StackAdapt.

Search Engine Marketing (SEM) Ads

As part of search engine marketing (SEM), Google Ads is a digital advertising platform where advertisers can bid on search terms (or keywords) to have informational ads displayed, where ads appear alongside search results. This campaign targets people most likely to be interested in relevant content by driving traffic to various pages on the TRC website. TRC has developed a search campaign to align with terms searched by individuals related to thermostats, mercury, mercury recycling, thermostat replacement, etc.

Search Engine Optimization (SEO)

Search Engine Optimization (SEO) is the process whereby a website is optimized through original content and on-site coding tactics to increase its chances of appearing near the top of "organic searches." An organic search is one that appears "naturally" in a search engine like Google or Bing. In other words, an organic listing is not ranked through paid search.

Organic traffic to a website typically brings visitors who stay longer, and visit more pages, on average.

In 2023, organic search traffic for all states brought 2,069 users to the TRC website. By comparison, 806 users were attributed to organic search over the same time period in 2022.

Social Media and Programmatic Ads

Through social media and programmatic advertising, advertisers can attract large audiences on the platforms they use for social networking and website browsing. This campaign targets people with relevant interests and drives them to various pages on the TRC website. For these ads, audiences on the various platforms were subdivided into various categories, such as consumer and contractor.

Digital Qualitative Analysis

Audience members most likely to take an action from our ads were consumers through Google Performance Max ads. In terms of search engine optimization, there was an increase in measured organic website traffic from 2022 to 2023, a result of ensuring Google crawlers were allowed on all pages of the website.

HOW MERCURY THERMOSTAT WASTE IS HANDLED

WASTE MERCURY-ADDED THERMOSTAT MANAGEMENT THROUGH VEOLIA ES TECHNICAL SOLUTIONS, LLC.

TRC containers with waste mercury-switch thermostats are received at a fulfillment/inventory center in Port Washington, Wisconsin (WIR000130591). The facility is owned and operated by Veolia ES Technical Solutions, L.L.C. (Veolia) under contract with TRC.

All recycling containers, including pails and bins are received at the loading dock and sent to the TRC inventory room. The container and plastic liner are opened and the contents are identified, sorted, and tallied. The following data is recorded for each bin returned and processed: bin number, business name (location name), city, state, zip code, date returned, number of thermostats and mercury switches by manufacturer and any non-conforming material.

The containers are returned to the location that sent it in with a new prepaid address label within 3 weeks of receipt. The thermostats are stored and staged in a plastic lined carton in a storage area for final processing. The containers are dated and processed in order received, first in-first out.

The thermostats and any loose bulbs collected from the containers are consolidated into a special 55-gallon drum which is labeled and dated according to regulations. The drum is sealed with a band and is only opened when contents are being added to it. Special negative pressure venting assures any fumes are captured and vented when the drum is opened.

The 55-gallon drum is then shipped to Veolia's mercury recovery facility (WID988566543) for final processing of the mercury ampules (switches). Veolia Environmental Services meets or exceeds all local, state, federal and EPA regulations for the management of the product.

The containers are returned from the storage area to the mercury recovery processing area to have the mercury bulbs removed from the plastic housing. Universal Waste Regulations require the recycling and disposal of waste within 12 months of acceptance at the processing facility.

Small quantities of thermostats are removed from the container, which is then closed again. The bulbs are removed from the thermostats and placed into processing vessel at the work station. Once the processing vessel is full, the vessel is loaded into the mercury recovery retort oven.

If a bulb breaks and the mercury spills, the work area is designed to contain the spillage and the operators are trained in the clean-up and disposal of mercury. The TRC inventory

and processing areas are equipped with special mercury vacuum cleaners and the work area is vacuumed at the end of the work day to ensure that any spillage is cleaned up and not left to evaporate.

Veolia meets or exceeds all local, state, federal and EPA regulations for the management of the product. The mercury recovery facility and process are permitted by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. Veolia's approvals for mercury recovery/recycling include:

- EPA identification WID988566543
- Hazardous Waste Storage License #6008
- Hazardous Waste Treatment License (Mercury Recovery Operations) #4585
- Air Operation Permit #246076050-S01
- Storm Water General Permit #WI-S067857-4

In addition to the regulatory permits, both Veolia Port Washington facilities have developed and maintain management systems in accordance with ISO 14001-2004, OHSAS 18001-2007, and Responsible Recycling (R2:2013) Practice. All persons who handle mercury thermostats as part of the TRC operation receive training in the handling of Hazardous Waste and Universal Waste.

The mercury containing ampules are retorted at Veolia's Port Washington Mineral Springs facility. The mercury is removed during the retort process. The post retort debris consists of broken glass ampules. The debris is tested for residual mercury to document the removal of the mercury to levels below the US EPA Land Disposal Restriction (LDR) levels. The debris is then disposal of as a non-hazardous solid waste at Advanced Disposal Glacier Ridge Landfill, LLC in Horicon, Wisconsin.
